With the right sides together, sew the live stitches from the left and right shoulders together using the tapestry needle.

Finishing the Neckband

Pick up and knit 24 stitches around the neckline. Knit 1, purl 1 for 5 rows to create a ribbed neckband. Bind off loosely.

Weaving in Ends and Blocking

Weave in any loose ends to secure your sweater. Blocking is optional, but it can help to even out the stitches and give the sweater a polished look.


