Story

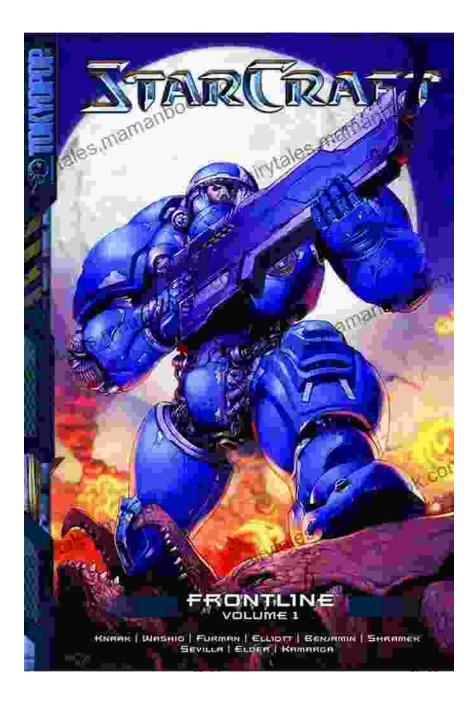

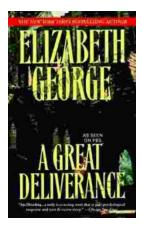
Overall
